Statement by Provincial Leader, Sister Charmaine Krohe and Provincial Council On the passing of Pope Francis

It is with great sadness that we, School Sisters of Notre Dame of the Atlantic-Midwest Province, join with the global community to mourn the passing of our dear Holy Father, Pope Francis. Our hearts are filled with gratitude for the gift of his life and pontificate.

Through his life and teachings, he showed us how to live simply, champion the poor and vulnerable, embrace all cultures and faiths, advocate for justice and peace, listen to the cries of the earth, and respond to the needs of the world with compassionate love. He was the quintessential example of servant leadership who embodied the values of the Gospel and reminded us that mercy matters.
