Florence Perez was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. on October 6, one of two siblings born to parents Alice Strhlein and Joseph Perez, both natives of Brooklyn. When Florence was three, her parents moved to District Heights, Maryland. She was enrolled in the public school and received weekly catechetical instruction from SSND. In the sixth grade she was enrolled in Mount Calvary School. Sister Mary Josine writes in her autobiography, "During the seventh and eighth grade, impressed by the sisters, I felt a desire to serve God."

Florence enter the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1957 at Mt. Calvary in Forestville, Maryland. She professed first vows in 1959 in Baltimore and received the name Mary Josine.
