Water Initiative



Help us in meeting our goal of reaching 100 additional families with water catchment systems in the coming year. Each catchment system will cost approximately \$350 each per household, and our goal is to raise \$35,000. This will enable a household to utilize rainwater for their home and garden use. Accompanying agricultural and nutritional education will

enable the garden to flourish as a source of food and income.
