Together with Pope Francis, we hold in our hearts that "We cannot tolerate [...] racism and exclusion in any form and yet defend the sacredness of every human life."

Dismantling racism is about changing ways that are harmful to our sisters and brothers which are different from us, and that are detrimental to the common good. Changing one's way needs to begin with becoming cognizant of one's ingrained thought and behavior patterns that consciously or unconsciously - favor some and exclude others. The prophet Isaiah's redefinition of the spiritual practice of fasting through rich and challenging imagery in ch. 58:6 can be applied to the impact of homogeneity, inequity and exclusion. His vision of fasting offers us a way toward diversity, equity and inclusion, a way that will lead to blessing and authentic communion, by way of

> Releasing those bound unjustly; Untying the thongs of the yoke; Setting free the oppressed, Breaking off every yoke. (Is 58:6)

- Uncover implicit biases
- Learn ways to redress biases when encountered in day-to-day interactions and in support of the work of advocacy

Participants will learn about implicit bias and develop ways to identify their own and how to counteract actively.

January 18 "Equity Filter -A Decision-Making Tool"

This session is dedicated to skill building. Participants will be introduced to a new tool, the Equity Filter. Together we will discuss and explore how to apply this tool.
