My name is Sister Charmaine Krohe, and I am the Provincial Leader of the SSND Atlantic-Midwest Province. I bring you special greetings and much gratitude to you as Board of Trustee Members.

As the outgoing Provincial, I want to thank you, leaders, Board chairs and board members for your commitment over the years I have served in leadership for the province. Your generosity of time, energy, and expertise has indeed been an inspiration to all of us. Over these past years, especially when the pandemic was at its worst, our province has seen how you have met the challenges that have arisen in each of your ministries. We have seen how you continued to serve one another, struggled to keep your boards involved and the committees working, continued to offer quality services and education, struggled to keep everyone safe on your campuses, adjusted to virtual gatherings and found ways to

With the polarization and divisions in the world, deepening communion is a call for all of us to go beyond our comfort zones and to cross borders of all kinds: geographical, international, cultural. When hearts are authentically open to universal communion, nothing and no one is excluded.

Our sponsored and co-sponsored ministries are meant to model a new way of being community. They are about how we treat our neighbor, deal with the less fortunate, and how we treat the stranger in our midst. Our ministries are about being the prophetic voice for the voiceless, standing up to the establishment in the name of God and in the name of justice. Our SSND ministries do not stand alone, in silos, or in isolation. We stand together. I have been convinced over my 13 ½ years of leadership that we need to continue to strive for that unity of which our foundress, Blessed Theresa spoke in her writings: “Unity alone makes us strong within and without; unity makes us indestructible.” Unity lightens the hardship and enables us to be prophetic witnesses of universal communion. I ask you to join hands with the council-elect as they lead us through the next four years and to celebrate the continuing call of Mother Theresa to “make one.”

Thank you for the wonderful opportunity to have this first-hand knowledge of all the good that you do as a sponsored and co-sponsored ministry for the Atlantic-Midwest Province. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as the Provincial leader and to experience you in action. Let us continue to pray for each other and work to make a difference in our world.
