SUGGESTED PROCESS FOR A VISIO DIVINA

Preparation: Find a quiet space. Gaze upon the image slowly and prayerfully. Let your heart settle.

Gaze and notice:

- The **flaming heart** pierced with light-symbol of divine love and transformation
- The **open book**-a nod to Augustine's scholarship and spiritual journey
- The crucifix modeled after Archbishop Desmond Tutu's a bridge between African bishops across time
- The crozier a symbol of pastoral leadership, echoing Augustine's role as bishop
- The stained glass of St. Monica his mother's enduring prayers
- The **pears** a reference to his youthful mischief and confession
- The **columbine flower (Aquilegia)** symbolizing faith and wisdom, and the unlikely blossoming of Augustine's life

Meditate:

- Try to see Augustine as a man, not an icon. What might be stirring in you?
- How might his African heritage deepen your understanding of his story?
- What part of his journey might mirror your own?

Pray: God of wisdom and transformation, pierce my heart as You did Augustine's. Let me see the unlikely beauty in my own story.

Contemplate: Sit in silence. Let the image and your prayer settle into your soul. Be open to what God may reveal.

Go forth to live it out:

Carry the image with you. Let Augustine's journey inspire your own:

- Embrace your past with honesty
- · Seek wisdom through study and prayer
- Let love be the flame that guides your path


