
Associates Serving on SSND Ministry Boards

This issue of United in Mission points to the collaboration between the province departments of Ministry Services and Associates. Formation has long been a focus shared by both departments, albeit with different approaches and for different goals.

Pre-Associate formation leads to a covenant relationship with the School Sisters of Notre Dame, Atlantic-Midwest Province. The initial formation of our leaders for sponsored ministries is designed to equip them as leaders to uphold and advance into the future the SSND spirit that sets our schools, university and our various educational ministries apart from secular educational institutions and non-profits. A deep underlying purpose regarding this initial and ongoing formation for both departments, is the deepening of the SSND charism within the (Pre-) Associate and the lay leader to share the charism of 'making one' to transform the world.

SSND Associates are men and women who make a yearly covenant to live the mission and ideals of Blessed Theresa in their daily lives and ministries.

Our lay leaders do that at their place of ministry in one of our nine sponsored ministries or various province departments.

Some of our lay leaders chose to become SSND Associates and through their covenant they bring an additional dimension to their work as staff members, administrators or volunteers in SSND sponsored ministries. Others serve on SSND committees flowing from the Directional Statement of the 24th General Chapter *Love Gives Everything*. In addition, other Associates have responded to the call to serve on boards of our SSND sponsored and co-sponsored ministries. This reflects an evolution of the charism pushing outward and forward to engage and promote the work of love and unity in new places, and invite others deeper into a value upheld by Provincial

Council as *communion in mission*.

Associates seek to deepen their spirituality, engage in social justice through advocacy or direct service to underserved people, but they mainly desire to grow spiritually **in** community and work **"with"** others for the rights of the poor and marginalized. It is this "with"ness that also draws them to serving on boards and their committees. This form of ministry displays a shared vision between the Provincial Council and the Associates, as it deepens the *communion in mission* with the SSNDs. It also raises the profile of Associates' service, as it is a new way of "prophetic witness of unity in diversity and service to God's people".

Mary Gunning, Board Member, Sisters Academy of Baltimore (SAB) - Baltimore, MD



I am a twelve-year product of SSND education and was drawn to Sisters Academy of Baltimore (SAB) as a result of that experience. The education I received was transformative and I wanted others individuals (particularly young girls who are marginalized) to have the same access to a high-quality education. In addition, I was familiar with SAB through my ministry at Catholic Charities Head Start of Baltimore City.

Sister Delia Dowling, SSND, had come to speak about SAB to our Head Start parents and always sent us recruitment information which we distributed to our families. In addition, several of our former Head Start students graduated from SAB. I was moved to serve on the board because many of our Baltimore City Public Schools do not meet the needs of our children and families and I knew SAB provided a top notch, wholistic education for young girls.

As an Associate, serving on an SSND board or committee provided me with an excellent way to live out one of our covenant promises "to participate in local and regional activities." In addition, there are many opportunities for networking with other board members which enhanced some of my personal and professional relationships. This opportunity enabled me to utilize my professional experience gained from working side by side with families who are experiencing poverty. It also provided an avenue for me to live out my desire to

"extend the spirit of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in service to God's people." I also arranged for a few Associates to tour SAB with the hope that they may find a way to become knowledgeable about the school and discern how they might be called to become involved.

I strongly encourage other Associates to explore opportunities and discern how they may be called to serve on AMSSND boards or committees. In addition to being a former SAB board member, I also am a member of the Haiti Collaboration Committee and Notre Dame Prep's Sustaining Transformation: Racial Inclusion, Value and Equity (STRIVE) Committee. While each of these experiences have been very different, there is a common thread that strengthens my understanding of our charism, mission centered focus and commitment to education in the broadest sense.
